Job 25:1 ¶ Then Bildad the Shuhite answered:

Job 25:2 “Dominion and fear are with God; he makes peace in his high heaven.

Job 25:3 Is there any number to his armies? Upon whom does his light not arise?

Job 25:6 how much less a mortal, who is a maggot, and a human being, who is a worm!”



Ex. 19:16 ¶ On the morning of the third day there was thunder and lightning, as well as a thick cloud on the mountain, and a blast of a trumpet so loud that all the people who were in the camp trembled.

Ex. 19:17 Moses brought the people out of the camp to meet God. They took their stand at the foot of the mountain.

Ex. 19:18 Now Mount Sinai was wrapped in smoke, because the Lord had descended upon it in fire; the smoke went up like the smoke of a kiln, while the whole mountain shook violently.

Ex. 20:18 ¶ When all the people witnessed the thunder and lightning, the sound of the trumpet, and the mountain smoking, they were afraid and trembled and stood at a distance,

Ex. 19:19 As the blast of the trumpet grew louder and louder, Moses would speak and God would answer him in thunder.

Ex. 19:20 When the Lord descended upon Mount Sinai, to the top of the mountain, the Lord summoned Moses to the top of the mountain, and Moses went up.

Ex. 20:20 Moses said to the people, “Do not be afraid; for God has come only to test you and to put the fear of him upon you so that you do not sin.”

Ex. 20:19 and said to Moses, “You speak to us, and we will listen; but do not let God speak to us, or we will die.”

Luke 19:37 As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen,

Luke 19:38 saying,

“Blessed is the king

who comes in the name of the Lord!

Peace in heaven,

and glory in the highest heaven!”

Luke 19:39 Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, “Teacher, order your disciples to stop.”

Luke 19:40 He answered, “I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out.”

Luke 19:41 ¶ As he came near and saw the city, he wept over it,

Luke 19:42 saying, “If you, even you, had only recognized on this day the things that make for peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes.

Luke 19:43 Indeed, the days will come upon you, when your enemies will set up ramparts around you and surround you, and hem you in on every side.

Luke 19:44 They will crush you to the ground, you and your children within you, and they will not leave within you one stone upon another; because you did not recognize the time of your visitation from God.”

Num. 12:1 ¶ While they were at Hazeroth, Miriam and Aaron spoke against Moses because of the Cushite woman whom he had married (for he had indeed married a Cushite woman);

Num. 12:2 and they said, “Has the Lord spoken only through Moses? Has he not spoken through us also?” And the Lord heard it.

Num. 12:3 Now the man Moses was very
humble, more so than anyone else on the
face of the earth.

Num. 12:4 Suddenly the Lord said to Moses, Aaron, and Miriam, “Come out, you three, to the tent of meeting.” So the three of them came out.

Num. 12:5 Then the Lord came down in a pillar of cloud, and stood at the entrance of the tent, and called Aaron and Miriam; and they both came forward.

Num. 12:6 And he said, "Hear my words:

When there are prophets among you,
I the Lord make myself known to them in
visions; I speak to them in dreams.


Num. 12:7 Not so with my servant Moses;
he is entrusted with all my house.

Num. 12:8 With him I speak face to face—
clearly, not in riddles;
and he beholds the form of the Lord.

Why then were you not afraid to speak against my
servant Moses?”


Job 23:3 Oh, that I knew
