“To the Hebrews: God’s Last Days Radiance”, pt 3

February 19, 2022

Heb. 2:16 For it is clear that he did
not come to help angels, but the
descendants of Abraham.



Heb. 2:17 Therefore he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect, so that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the people.




Heb. 1:3 And He is the radiance of His glory and
the exact representation of His nature, and
upholds all things by the word of His power.
When He had made purification of sins, He sat
down at the right hand of the Majesty on high,



Heb. 2:18 For since He Himself was
tempted in that which He has
suffered, He is able to come to the
aid of those who are tempted.



Heb. 3:1 ¶ Therefore, brothers and sisters, holy
partners in a heavenly calling, consider that Jesus,
the apostle and high priest of our confession, 
Heb. 3:2 was faithful to the one who appointed him,
just as Moses also “was faithful in all God’s house.”

Ex. 40:16 Thus Moses did;


according to all that the LORD
had commanded him, so he did.



Ex. 40:17 In the first month in the second year, on the first day of the month, the tabernacle was set up.

Ex. 40:18 Moses set up the tabernacle; he laid its bases, and set up its frames, and put in its poles, and raised up its pillars;



Ex. 32:1 ¶ When the people saw that Moses delayed to come down from the mountain, the people gathered around Aaron, and said to him, "Come, make gods for us, who shall go before us; as for this Moses, the man who brought us up out of the land of Egypt, we do not know what has become of him." 

Ex. 32:2 Aaron said to them, "Take off the gold rings that are on the ears of your wives, your sons, and your daughters, and bring them to me."

Ex. 32:3 So all the people took off the gold rings from their ears, and brought them to Aaron.

Ex. 32:4 He took the gold from them, formed it in a mold,^a and cast an image of a calf; and they said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!"



Heb. 3:3 Yet Jesus is worthy of more glory than Moses, just as the builder of a house has more honor than the house itself.



Heb. 3:4 (For every house is built by someone, but the builder of all things is God.)

Ex. 40:34 ¶ Then the cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle.

Ex. 40:35 Moses was not able to enter the tent of meeting because the cloud settled upon it, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle.



Heb. 3:5 Now Moses was faithful in
all God's house as a servant, to
testify to the things that would be
spoken later.



Heb. 3:6 Christ, however, was faithful
over God's house as a son, and we are
his house if we hold firm the confidence
and the pride that belong to hope.



Gal. 4:6 And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!"

Gal. 4:7 So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.



Ex. 32:29 Moses said, "Today you have ordained yourselves for the service of the LORD, each one at the cost of a son or a brother, and so have brought a blessing on yourselves this day."



Ex. 32:32 But now, if you will only
forgive their sin—but if not, blot me
out of the book that you have
written.”



Ex. 33:11 Thus the LORD used to speak to Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend. Then he would return to the camp; but his young assistant, Joshua son of Nun, would not leave the tent.



Ex. 33:17 ¶ The LORD said to Moses, "I will do the very thing that you have asked; for you have found favor in my sight, and I know you by name."

Ex. 33:18 Moses said, "Show me your glory, I pray."



Ex. 33:20 But," he said, "you
cannot see my face; for no one
shall see me and live."



Heb. 3:7 Therefore, as the Holy Spirit says,

“Today, if you hear his voice,

Heb. 3:8 do not harden your hearts as in

the rebellion,



as on the day of testing in the wilderness,

Heb. 3:9 where your ancestors put me to the test,
though they had seen my works

Heb. 3:10 for forty years.

Therefore I was angry with that generation,
and I said, 'They always go astray in their hearts,
and they have not known my ways.'



Psa. 95:7 For He is our God,

And we are the people of His pasture and the sheep
of His hand.

Today, if you would hear His voice,

Psa. 95:8 Do not harden your hearts, as at Meribah,

As in the day of Massah in the wilderness,



Heb. 3:11 As in my anger I swore,
‘They will not enter my rest.’”



Heb. 3:12 Take care, brothers and sisters, that none of you may have an evil, unbelieving heart that turns away from the living God.

Heb. 3:13 But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called "today," so that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin.



Heb. 3:14 For we have become
partners of Christ, if only we hold
our first confidence firm to the end.



Ex. 40:12 Then you shall bring Aaron and his sons to the entrance of the tent of meeting, and shall wash them with water,

Ex. 40:13 and put on Aaron the sacred vestments, and you shall anoint him and consecrate him, so that he may serve me as priest.



Heb. 3:6 Christ, however, was faithful over God's house as a son, and we are his house if we hold firm the confidence and the pride that belong to hope.

Mark 14:36 He said, "Abba, Father, for you all things are possible; remove this cup from me; yet, not what I want, but what you want."
