Heb. 1:1 ¶ Long ago God spoke to our ancestors
in many and various ways by the prophets,

John 17:24 Father, I desire that those also,
whom you have given me, may be with me
where I am, to see my glory, which you have
given me because you loved me before the
foundation of the world.



Ex. 19:11 and prepare for the third day,
because on the third day the LORD will
come down upon Mount Sínai in the sight
of all the people.



Ex. 19:13 No hand shall touch them, but they shall be stoned or shot with arrows; whether animal or human being, they shall not live.' When the trumpet sounds a long blast, they may go up on the mountain."



Ex. 20:18 ¶ When all the people witnessed
the thunder and lightning, the sound of the
trumpet, and the mountain smoking, they
were afraid and trembled and stood at a
distance,



Ex. 20:19 and said to Moses, "You speak to us, and we will listen; but do not let God speak to us, or we will die."



Heb. 1:1 ¶ Long ago God spoke to

Ex. 3:7 ¶ Then the LORD said, "I have observed the misery of my people who are in Egypt; I have heard their cry on account of their taskmasters. Indeed, I know their sufferings, Ex. 3:8 and I have come down to deliver them from the Egyptians, and to bring them up out of that land to a good and broad land, a land flowing with milk and honey..."



Heb. 1:4 having become as much

Heb. 1:5 ¶ For to which of the angels did God ever say,

“You are my Son;
today I have begotten you”?

Or again,

“I will be his Father,
and he will be my Son”?



Heb. 1:6 And again, when he brings
the firstborn into the world, he

says,



“Let all God’s angels worship him.”

Heb. 1:7 Of the angels he says,

“He makes his angels winds,
and his servants flames of fire.”



Heb. 1:8 But of the Son he says,

“Your throne, O God, is forever and ever,

and the righteous scepter is the scepter of your kingdom.

Heb. 1:9 You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness;

therefore God, your God, has anointed you

with the oil of gladness beyond your companions.”



Heb. 1:10 And,

“In the beginning, Lord, you founded the earth,
and the heavens are the work of your hands;

Heb. 1:11 they will perish, but you remain;
they will all wear out like clothing;

Heb. 1:12 like a cloak you will roll them up,
and like clothing^a they will be changed.

But you are the same,
and your years will never end.”

“Sit at my right hand
until I make your enemies a
footstool for your feet”?
