Ecc. 5:3 ¶ For dreams come

voice with many words.



Eccl. 5:4 ¶ When you make a vow to God, do not delay fulfilling it; for he has no pleasure in fools. Fulfill what you vow.

Eccl. 5:5 It is better that you should not vow than that you should vow and not fulfill it.



Eccl. 5:6 Do not let your mouth lead you into sin, and do not say before the messenger that it was a mistake; why should God be angry at your words, and destroy the work of your hands?



Ecccl. 5:7 ¶ With many dreams

come vanities and a multitude of
words; but fear God.



Ex. 19:6 and you shall be to Me a
kingdom of priests and a holy nation.’
These are the words that you shall
speak to the sons of Israel.”



1Kings 11:5 For Solomon followed Astarte the goddess of the Sidonians, and Milcom the abomination of the Ammonites.

1Kings 11:6 So Solomon did what was evil in the sight of the LORD, and did not completely follow the LORD, as his father David had done.



1Kings 8:46 ¶ “If they sin against you—for there is no one who does not sin—and you are angry with them and give them to an enemy, so that they are carried away captive to the land of the enemy, far off or near;



1Kings 8:49 then hear in heaven your dwelling place their prayer and their plea, maintain their cause

1Kings 8:50 and forgive your people who have sinned against you, and all their transgressions that they have committed against you; and grant them compassion in the sight of their captors, so that they may have compassion on them



Eccl. 5:8 ¶ If you see in a province the oppression of the poor and the violation of justice and right, do not be amazed at the matter; for the high official is watched by a higher, and there are yet higher ones over them.

Eccl. 5:9 But all things considered, this is an advantage for a land: a king for a plowed field.



Eccl. 5:10 ¶ The lover of money will not be satisfied with money; nor the lover of wealth, with gain. This also is vanity.

Eccl. 5:11 ¶ When goods increase, those who eat them increase; and what gain has their owner but to see them with his eyes?



Eccl. 5:12 The sleep of the working man is pleasant, whether he eats little or much; but the full stomach of the rich man does not allow him to sleep.



Eccl. 5:13 ¶ There is a grievous ill that I have seen
under the sun: riches were kept by their owners to
their hurt,

Eccl. 5:14 and those riches were lost in a bad venture;
though they are parents of children, they have
nothing in their hands.



Eccl. 5:15 As they came from their mother's womb, so they shall go again, naked as they came; they shall take nothing for their toil, which they may carry away with their hands.

Eccl. 5:16 This also is a grievous ill: just as they came, so shall they go; and what gain do they have from toiling for the wind?



Eccl. 5:17 Besides, all their days they eat in darkness, in much vexation and sickness and resentment.

Eccl. 5:9 But all things considered, this is an advantage for a land: a king for a plowed field.



Eccl. 5:18 ¶ This is what I have seen to be good: it is fitting to eat and drink and find enjoyment in all the toil with which one toils under the sun the few days of the life God gives us; for this is our lot.



Eccl. 5:19 Likewise all to whom God gives wealth and possessions and whom he enables to enjoy them, and to accept their lot and find enjoyment in their toil—this is the gift of God.

Gen. 3:17 And to the man he said,
