Matt. 5:8 ¶ "Blessed are the pure  
in heart, for they will see God.



Matt. 6:1 ¶ “Beware of practicing your righteousness before men to be noticed by them; otherwise you have no reward with your Father who is in heaven.



Matt. 6:2 ¶ "So when you give to the poor, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be honored by men. Truly I say to you, they have their reward in full.





Matt. 6:3 "But when you give to the poor, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing,  
Matt. 6:4 so that your giving will be in secret; and your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you.





Matt. 6:16 ¶ “And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward.



Matt. 6:17 But when you fast, put oil on your head  
and wash your face,

Matt. 6:18 so that your fasting may be seen not by  
others but by your Father who is in secret; and  
your Father who sees in secret will reward you.



Is. 58:1 ¶ Shout out, do not hold back! Lift up your voice like a trumpet! Announce to my people their rebellion, to the house of Jacob their sins.

Is. 58:2 Yet day after day they seek me and delight to know my ways, as if they were a nation that practiced righteousness and did not forsake the ordinance of their God; they ask of me righteous judgments, they delight to draw near to God.



Is. 58:4 Look, you fast only to quarrel  
and to fight and to strike with a wicked  
fist. Such fasting as you do today will  
not make your voice heard on high.





Is. 58:5 Is such the fast that I choose, a day  
to humble oneself? Is it to bow down the  
head like a bulrush, and to lie in sackcloth  
and ashes? Will you call this a fast, a day  
acceptable to the LORD?



Is. 58:6 ¶ Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?

Is. 58:7 Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin?



Is. 58:8 Then your light shall break forth like  
the dawn, and your healing shall spring up  
quickly; your vindicator shall go before you,  
the glory of the LORD shall be your rear  
guard.





Is. 58:9 Then you shall call, and the LORD will answer; you shall cry for help, and he will say, Here I am. ¶ If you remove the yoke from among you, the pointing of the finger, the speaking of evil,

Is. 58:10 if you offer your food to the hungry and satisfy the needs of the afflicted, then your light shall rise in the darkness and your gloom be like the noonday.



Is. 58:11 The LORD will guide you continually,  
and satisfy your needs in parched places,  
and make your bones strong; and you shall  
be like a watered garden, like a spring of  
water, whose waters never fail.



2Tim. 3:5 holding to the
