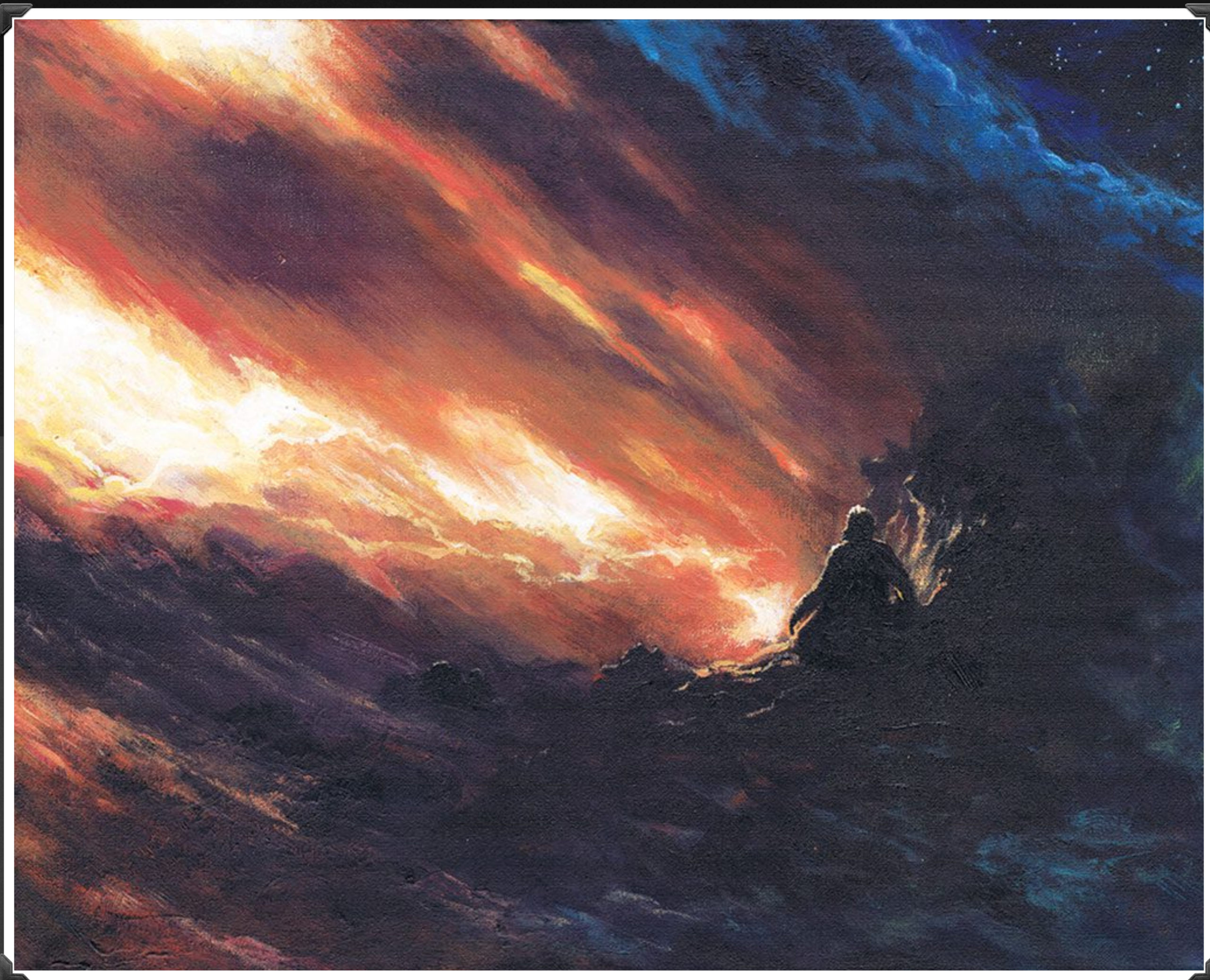


“...Show Me Your Glory,’ Please?”

Gen. 1:27 So God created humankind

in his image,



in the image of God he created them;

male and female he created them.

Gen. 2:16 And the LORD God commanded the man,
“You may freely eat of every tree of the garden;
Gen. 2:17 but of the tree of the knowledge of good
and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you
eat of it you shall die.”



Gen. 2:7 then the LORD God formed man from the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being.

Gen. 2:18 ¶ Then the LORD God said, “It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner.”



Gen. 2:21 So the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh.

Gen. 2:22 And the rib that the LORD God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man.



Ex. 20:4 ¶ You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth.



Gen. 12:1 ¶ Now the LORD said to

Abram, "Go from your country and
your kindred and your father's house
to the land that I will show you.



Josh. 24:2 And Joshua said to all the people, "Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel: Long ago your ancestors—Terah and his sons Abraham and Nahor—lived beyond the Euphrates and served other gods.



Gen. 18:24 Suppose there are fifty righteous within the city; will you then sweep away the place and not forgive it for the fifty righteous who are in it?

Gen. 18:25 Far be it from you to do such a thing, to slay the righteous with the wicked, so that the righteous fare as the wicked! Far be that from you! Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just?"



Ex. 1:22 Then Pharaoh commanded all his people, "Every boy that is born to the Hebrews you shall throw into the Nile, but you shall let every girl live."



Ex. 3:6 He said further, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God.



Ex. 3:7 ¶ Then the LORD said, “I have observed the misery of my people who are in Egypt; I have heard their cry on account of their taskmasters. Indeed, I know their sufferings, Ex. 3:8 and I have come down to deliver them from the Egyptians, and to bring them up out of that land to a good and broad land, a land flowing with milk and honey...



Ex. 3:7 & 8 ¶ Then the LORD said...

“I am God”

“I know my people’s misery”

“I have heard their cries”

“I have come down to deliver them”



Ex. 19:11 and prepare for the third day,
because on the third day the LORD will
come down upon Mount Sinai in the sight
of all the people.



Ex. 19:13 No hand shall touch them, but they shall be stoned or shot with arrows; whether animal or human being, they shall not live.' When the trumpet sounds a long blast, they may go up on the mountain."



Ex. 20:18 ¶ When all the people witnessed the thunder and lightning, the sound of the trumpet, and the mountain smoking, they were afraid and trembled and stood at a distance,



Ex. 20:19 and said to Moses, “You speak to us, and we will listen; but do not let God speak to us, or we will die.”

Ex. 20:21 Then the people stood at a distance, while Moses drew near to the thick darkness where God was.

Ex. 20:22 ¶ The LORD said to Moses: Thus you shall say to the Israelites: "You have seen for yourselves that I spoke with you from heaven.



Deut. 5:22 ¶ These words the LORD spoke with a loud voice to your whole assembly at the mountain, out of the fire, the cloud, and the thick darkness, and he added no more. He wrote them on two stone tablets, and gave them to me.



Deut. 5:23 When you heard the voice out of the darkness,
while the mountain was burning with fire, you approached me,
all the heads of your tribes and your elders;

Deut. 5:24 and you said, "Look, the LORD our God has
shown us his glory and greatness, and we have heard his
voice out of the fire. Today we have seen that God may speak
to someone and the person may still live.



Deut. 5:25 So now why should we die? For this great fire will consume us; if we hear the voice of the LORD our God any longer, we shall die.



Ex. 33:18 Moses said, "Show me your
glory, I pray."

Deut. 5:28 ¶ The LORD heard your words when you spoke to me, and the LORD said to me: “I have heard the words of this people, which they have spoken to you; they are right in all that they have spoken.

Deut. 5:29 If only they had such a mind as this, to fear me and to keep all my commandments always, so that it might go well with them and with their children forever!

Deut. 5:30 Go say to them, ‘Return to your tents.’



Deut. 5:31 But you, stand here by me, and I will tell you all the commandments, the statutes and the ordinances, that you shall teach them, so that they may do them in the land that I am giving them to possess.”
