Acts 16:4 As they went from town to town, they delivered to them for observance the decisions that had been reached by the apostles and elders who were in Jerusalem. Acts 16:5 So the churches were strengthened in the faith and increased in numbers daily.





Acts 16:6 ¶ They went through the region of Phrygia and Galatía, having been forbidden by the Holy Spirit to speak the word in Asia.

Acts 16:7 When they had come opposite Mysia, they attempted to go into Bithynia, but the Spirit of Jesus did not allow them;

Acts 16:8 so, passing by Mysia, they went down to Troas.






Acts 16:9 During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." Acts 16:10 When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.






Acts 16:12 and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days.








Acts 16:14 A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul.








Acts 16:16 ¶ One day as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a female slave who had a spirit of divination and brought ner owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling.





Acts 16:17 While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, "These men are slaves of the Most High God, who proclaim to youk the way of salvation."








Acts 16:19 ¶ But when her owners saw that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace before the authorities.\* Acts 16:20 When they had brought them before the magistrates, they said, "These men, these Jews, are disturbing our city\*

Acts 16:21 and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us, being Romans, to adopt or observe."





Acts 16:22 The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods.



Acts 16:23 After they had given them a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely.




## Acts 16:24 Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks.



Acts 16:25 ¶ About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them.




Acts 16:26 Suddenly there was an earthquake so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken, and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were untastened.






Acts 16:27 When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped.






## Acts 16:28 But Paul shouted in a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here."

Acts 16:31 They answered, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." Acts 16:32 They spoke the word of the Lord m to him and to all who were in his house.





Acts 16:33 At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and his entire family were baptized without delay.


Acts 16:34 He brought them up into the house and set food before them, and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.






Rev. 13:9 ¶ Let anyone who has an ear listen:




Acts 16:40 After leaving the prison they went to Lydia's nome, and when they had seen and encouraged the brothers and sisters there, they departed.
