Gen. 16:1 ¶ Now Sarai, Abram's wife, bore him no children. She had an Egyptian slave whose name was Hagar,

Gen. 16:2 and Sarai said to Abram, "You see that the LORD has prevented me from bearing children; go in to my slave; it may be that I shall obtain children by her." And Abram listened to the voice of Sarai.



Gen. 16:3 So, after Abram had lived ten years in the land of Canaan, Sarai, Abram's wife, took Hagar the Egyptian, her slave, and gave her to her husband Abram as a wife.



Gen. 16:4 He went in to Hagar,
and she conceived, and when
she saw that she had
conceived, she looked with
contempt on her mistress.



Gen. 16:5 Then Sarai said to Abram,
“May the wrong done to me be on you!

when she saw that she had conceived,

Gen. 16:7 ¶ The angel of the LORD found her by a spring of water in the wilderness, the spring on the way to Shur.

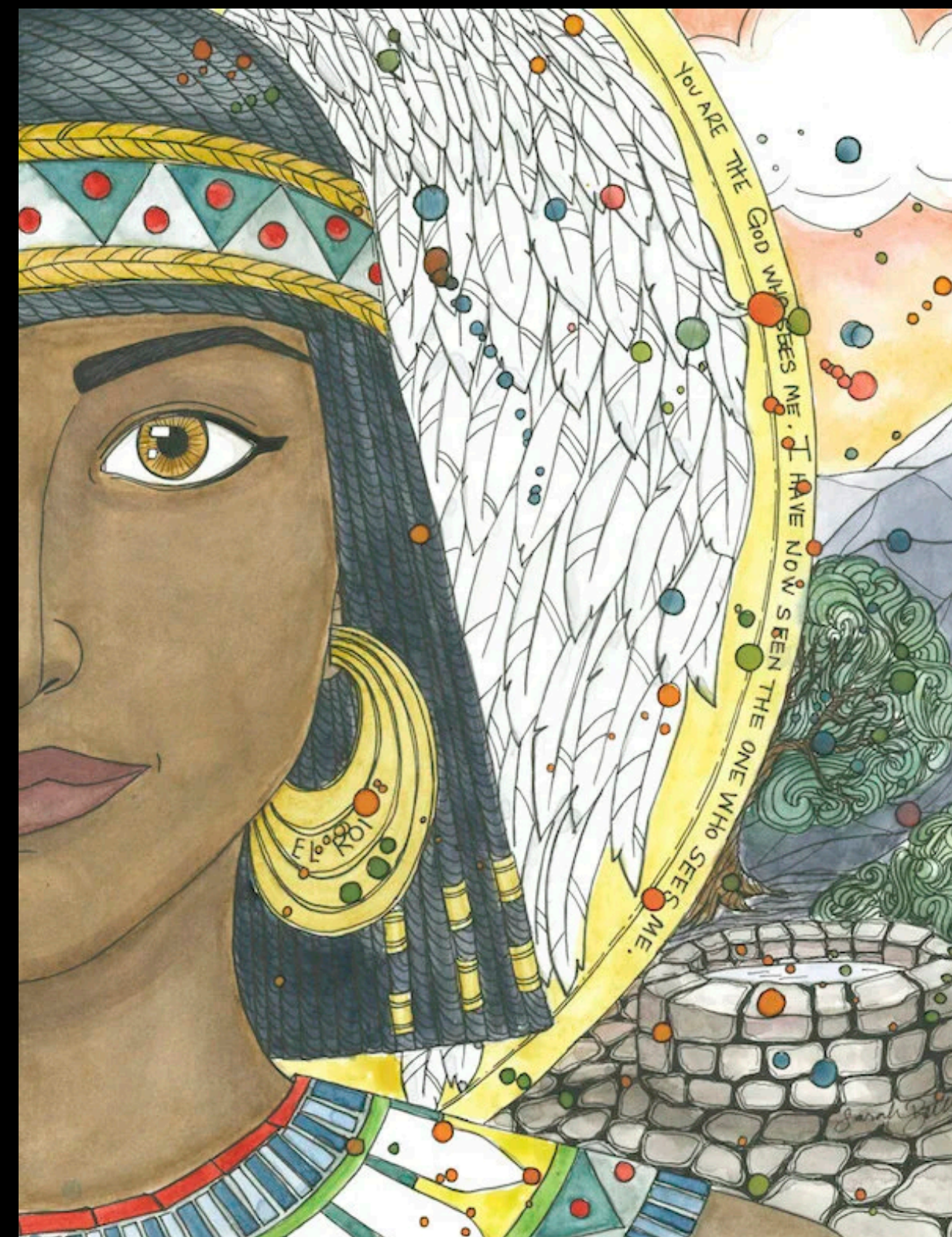
Gen. 16:8 And he said, "Hagar, slave of Sarai, where have you come from and where are you going?" She said, "I am running away from my mistress Sarai."

her."

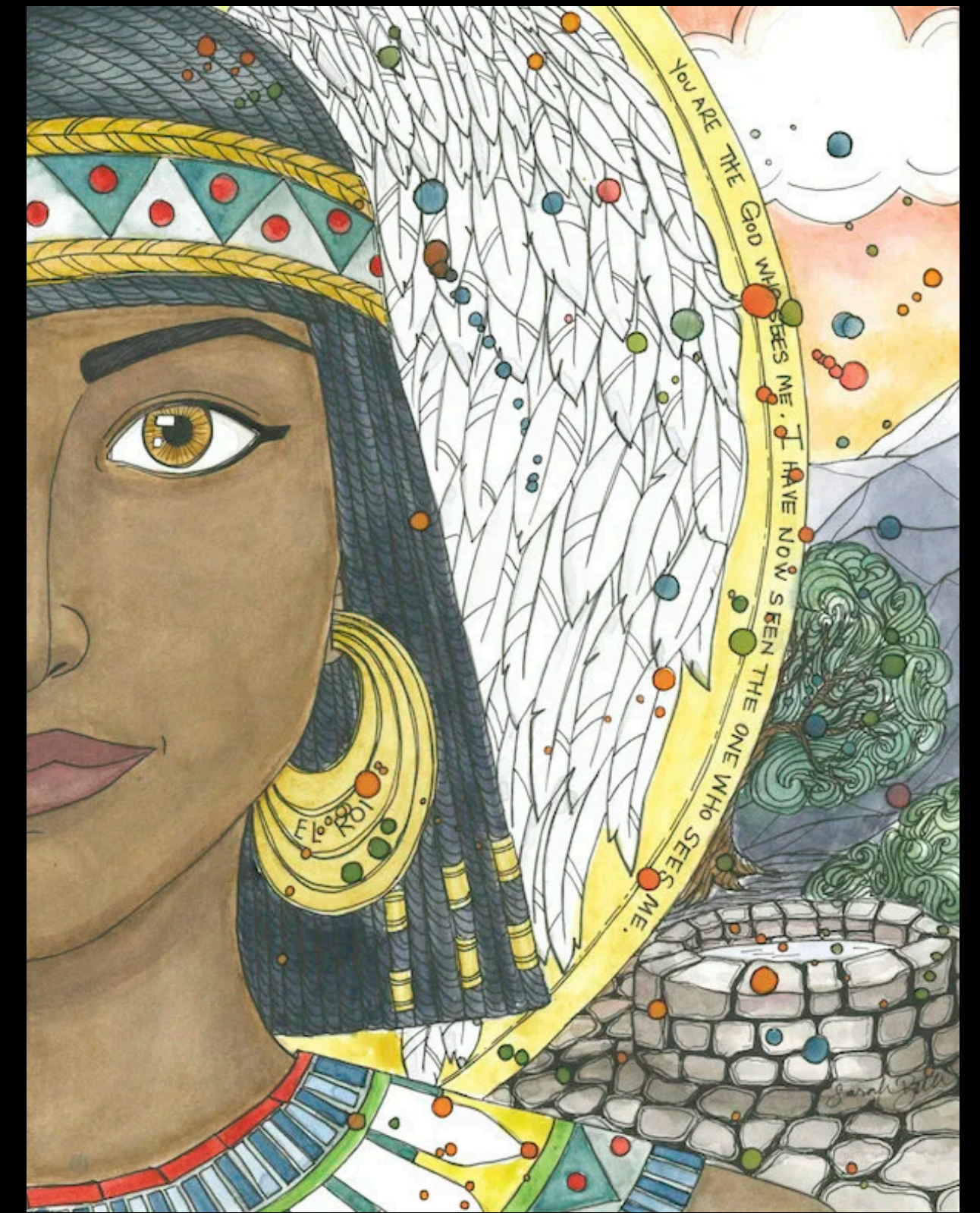


Gen. 16:10 The angel of the LORD also said to her, "I will so greatly multiply your offspring that they cannot be counted for multitude."



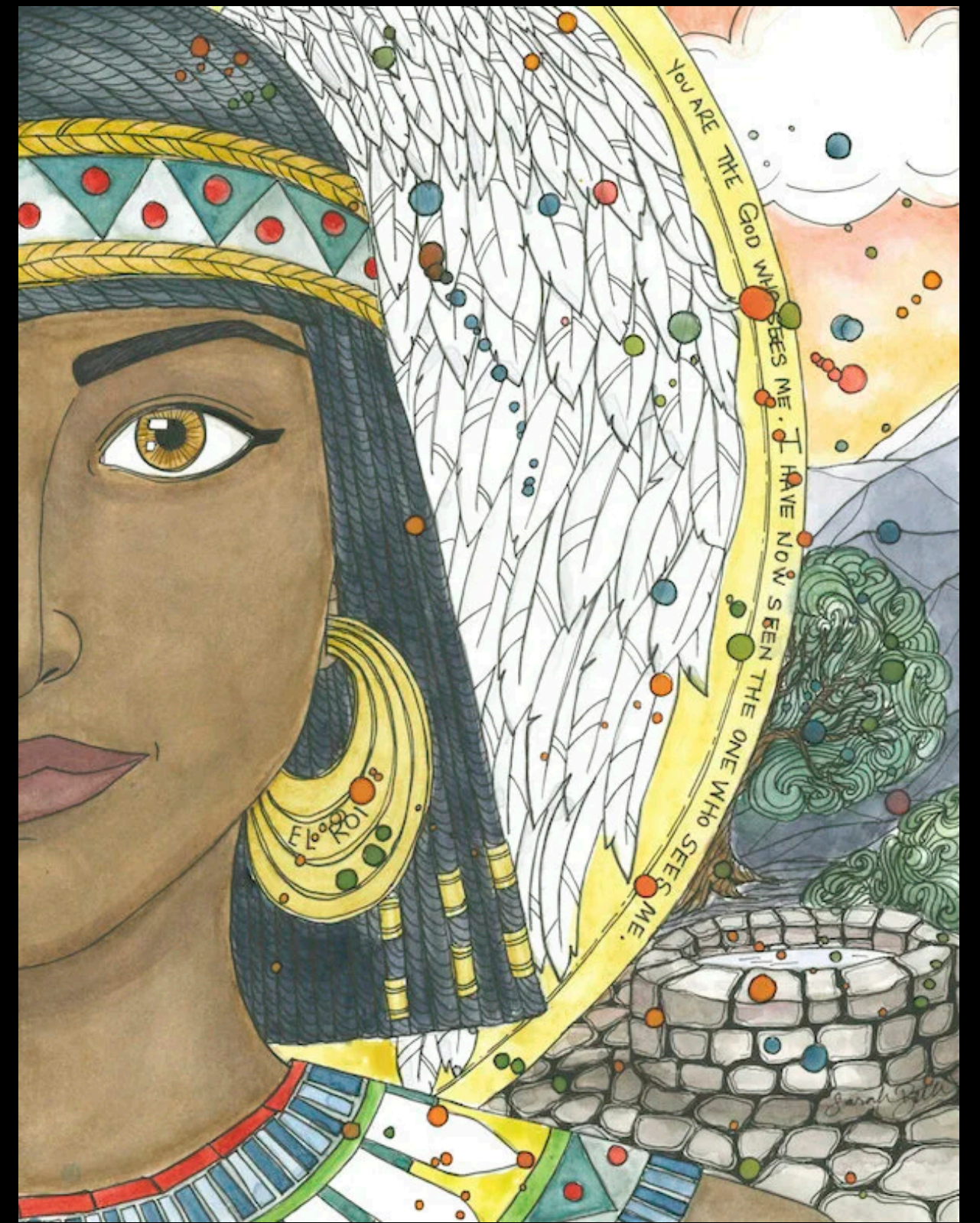
Gen. 16:11 And the angel of the LORD said to her,
