Gen. 22:9 ¶ When they came to the place that God had shown him, Abraham built an altar there and laid the wood in order. He bound his son Isaac and laid him on the altar on top of the wood.

LORD will provide”). To this day,  
people still use that name as a  
proverb: “On the mountain of the  
LORD it will be provided.”
