“From the Word to Stone to Flesh: Torah’s Living Covenant,” Pt 12



Gen. 24:7 The LORD, the God of heaven,
who took me from my father's house and
from the land of my birth and who spoke
to me and swore to me, 'To your offspring I
will give this land,' he will send his angel
before you, and you shall take a wife for
my son from there.



Gen. 24:10 ¶ Then the servant took ten of his master's camels and departed, taking all kinds of choice gifts from his master, and he set out and went to Aram-naharaim, to the city of Nahor.



Gen. 24:11 He made the camels
kneel down outside the city by
the well of water; it was toward
evening, the time when women
go out to draw water.



Gen. 24:12 And he said, "O LORD, God of my master Abraham, please grant me success today and show steadfast love to my master Abraham.



Gen. 24:13 I am standing here by the spring of water, and the daughters of the townspeople are coming out to draw water.



Gen. 24:14 Let the young woman to whom I shall say, 'Please offer your jar that I may drink,' and who shall say, 'Drink, and I will water your camels'—let her be the one whom you have appointed for your servant Isaac. By this I shall know that you have shown steadfast love to my master."



Gen. 24:15 ¶ Before he had finished speaking, there was Rebekah, who was born to Bethuel son of Milcah, the wife of Nahor, Abraham's brother, coming out with her water jar on her shoulder.

Gen. 24:16 The young woman was very fair to look upon, a virgin, whom no man had known. She went down to the spring, filled her jar, and came up.



Gen. 24:17 Then the servant ran to meet her and said, "Please let me sip a little water from your jar."

Gen. 24:18 "Drink, my lord," she said and quickly lowered her jar upon her hand and gave him a drink.



Gen. 24:19 When she had finished giving him a drink, she said, "I will draw for your camels also, until they have finished drinking."



Gen. 24:20 So she quickly emptied her jar into the trough and ran again to the well to draw, and she drew for all his camels.



Gen. 24:21 The man gazed at her in silence to learn whether or not the LORD had made his journey successful.



Gen. 24:22 ¶ When the camels had finished drinking, the man took a gold nose ring weighing a half shekel and two bracelets for her arms weighing ten gold shekels



Gen. 24:23 and said, “Tell me whose daughter you are. Is there room in your father’s house for us to spend the night?”



Gen. 24:24 She said to him, "I am the daughter of Bethuel son of Milcah, whom she bore to Nahor."



Gen. 24:25 She added, "We have plenty of straw and fodder and a place to spend the night."



Gen. 24:26 The man bowed his head and
worshipped the LORD
Gen. 24:27 and said, "Blessed be the LORD,
the God of my master Abraham, who has not
forsaken his steadfast love and his faithfulness
toward my master. As for me, the LORD has led
me on the way to the house of my master's kin."



Gen. 24:28 ¶ Then the
young woman ran and told
her mother's household
about these things.



Gen. 24:29 Rebekah had a brother whose name was Laban, and Laban ran out to the man, to the spring.

Gen. 24:30 As soon as he had seen the nose ring and the bracelets on his sister's arms and when he heard the words of his sister Rebekah, "Thus the man spoke to me," he went to the man, and there he was, standing by the camels at the spring.

Gen. 24:31 He said, "Come in, O blessed of the LORD. Why do you stand outside when I have prepared the house and a place for the camels?"



Gen. 24:34 ¶ So he said, "I am Abraham's servant.

Gen. 24:35 The LORD has greatly blessed my master, and he has become wealthy; he has given him flocks and herds, silver and gold, male and female slaves, camels and donkeys.



Gen. 24:50 ¶ Then Laban and Bethuel answered, “The thing comes from the LORD; we cannot speak to you anything bad or good.



Gen. 24:51 Look, Rebekah is before you, take her and go, and let her be the wife of your master's son, as the LORD has spoken.”



Gen. 24:52 ¶ When Abraham's servant heard their words, he bowed himself to the ground before the LORD.

Gen. 24:53 And the servant brought out jewelry of silver and of gold and garments and gave them to Rebekah; he also gave to her brother and to her mother costly ornaments.



Gen. 24:58 And they called
Rebekah and said to her,
“Will you go with this man?”
She said, “I will.”



Gen. 24:61 ¶ Then Rebekah and her maids rose up, mounted the camels, and followed the man, and the servant took Rebekah and went his way.



Gen. 24:62 ¶ Now Isaac had come from Beer-lahai-roi and was settled in the Negeb.



Gen. 24:63 Isaac went out in the evening to walk in the field, and, looking up, he saw camels coming.



Gen. 24:64 And Rebekah looked up, and when she saw Isaac, she slipped quickly from the camel

Gen. 24:65 and said to the servant, "Who is the man over there, walking in the field to meet us?" The servant said, "It is my master." So she took her veil and covered herself.



Gen. 24:62 ¶ Now Isaac had come from
Beer-lahai-roi and was settled in the
Negeb.

Gen. 24:63 Isaac went out ...looking up, he
saw camels coming.

Gen. 24:64 And Rebekah looked up, and
when she saw Isaac...



Gen. 26:1 ¶ Now there was a famine in the land, besides the former famine that had occurred in the days of Abraham. And Isaac went to Gerar, to King Abimelech of the Philistines.



Gen. 26:2 The LORD appeared to Isaac^c and said, "Do not go down to Egypt; settle in the land that I shall show you.

Gen. 26:3 Reside in this land as an alien, and I will be with you and will bless you, for to you and to your descendants I will give all these lands, and I will fulfill the oath that I swore to your father Abraham.



Gen. 26:4 I will make your offspring as numerous as the stars of heaven and will give to your offspring all these lands, and all the nations of the earth shall gain blessing for themselves through your offspring,

Gen. 26:5 because Abraham obeyed my voice and kept my charge, my commandments, my statutes, and my laws.”



Gen. 26:6 ¶ So Isaac settled in Gerar.

Gen. 26:7 When the men of the place asked him about his wife, he said, "She is my sister," for he was afraid to say "my wife," thinking, "or else the men of the place might kill me for the sake of Rebekah, because she is attractive in appearance."



John 1:9 If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Gal. 3:13 Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us—for it is written, “Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree” —
