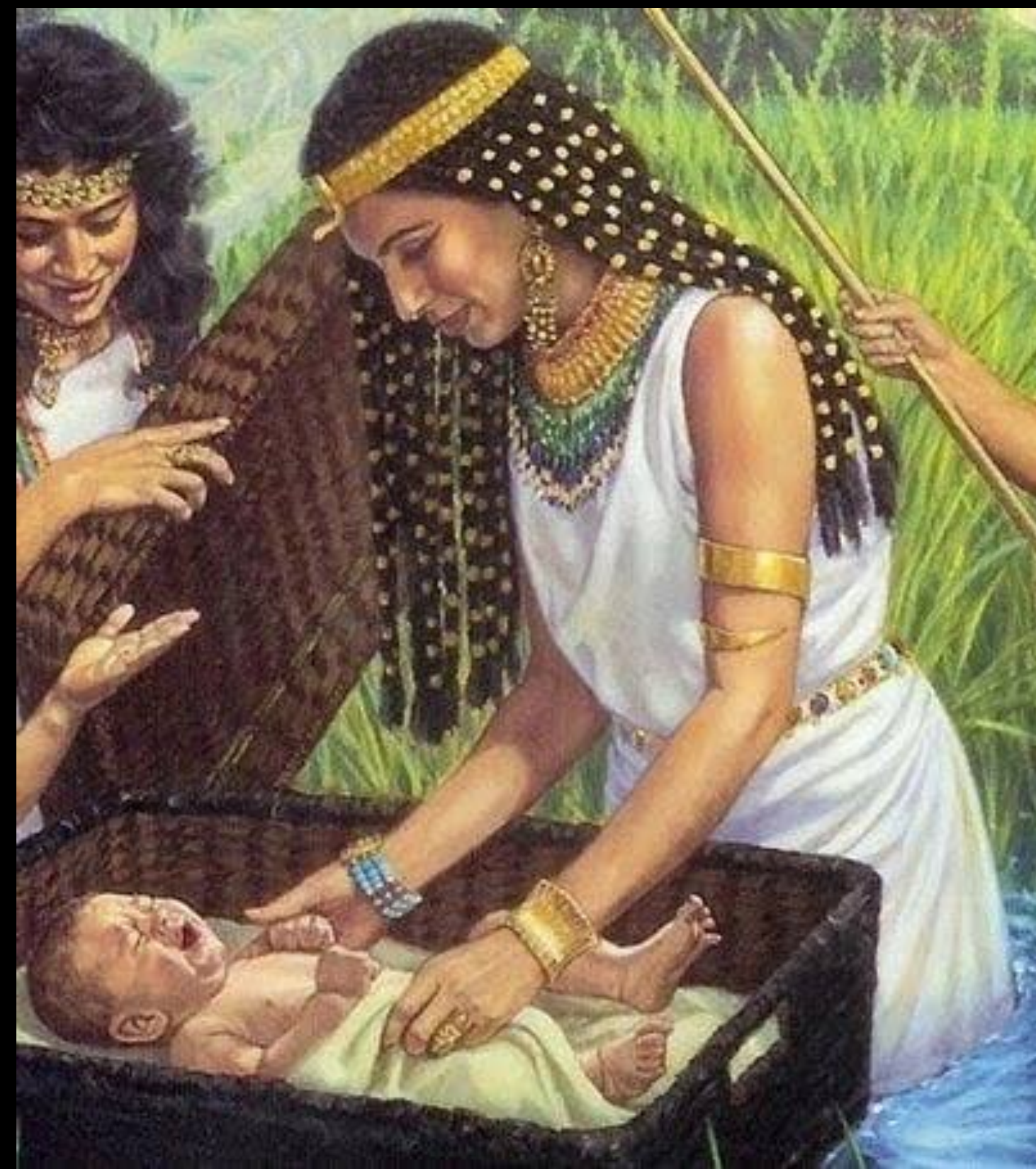

- Both had attempts on their lives as infants.
- Both fasted 40 days then gave the law from or on mountains
- Moses leads 12 tribes.
- Jesus leads 12 disciples
- Both appoint 70:
 - Moses - Elders
 - Jesus - Evangelists



- Moses leads Israel out of slavery to a new land & new way of life
- Jesus leads spiritual Israel out of two slaveries
 - Our sin
 - The misuse of the very religion they
 - believed Moses led them to
(legal, intercessory, meritorious)



Rom. 8:1 ¶ Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.

Rom. 8:2 For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death.





Ex. 1:11 ...they (Pharaoh & Egypt) set taskmasters over them to oppress them with forced labor. They built supply cities, Pithom and Rameses, for Pharaoh.

Ex. 1:12 But the more they were oppressed, the more they multiplied and spread, so that the Egyptians came to dread the Israelites.





Ex. 1:13 The Egyptians subjected the Israelites to hard servitude
Ex. 1:14 and made their lives bitter with hard servitude in mortar and
bricks and in every kind of field labor. They were ruthless in all the
tasks that they imposed on them.





Rom. 7:18 For I know that the good does not dwell within me, that is, in my flesh. For the desire to do the good lies close at hand, but not the ability.

Rom. 7:19 For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do.





Rom. 7:20 Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I who do it but sin that dwells within me.
