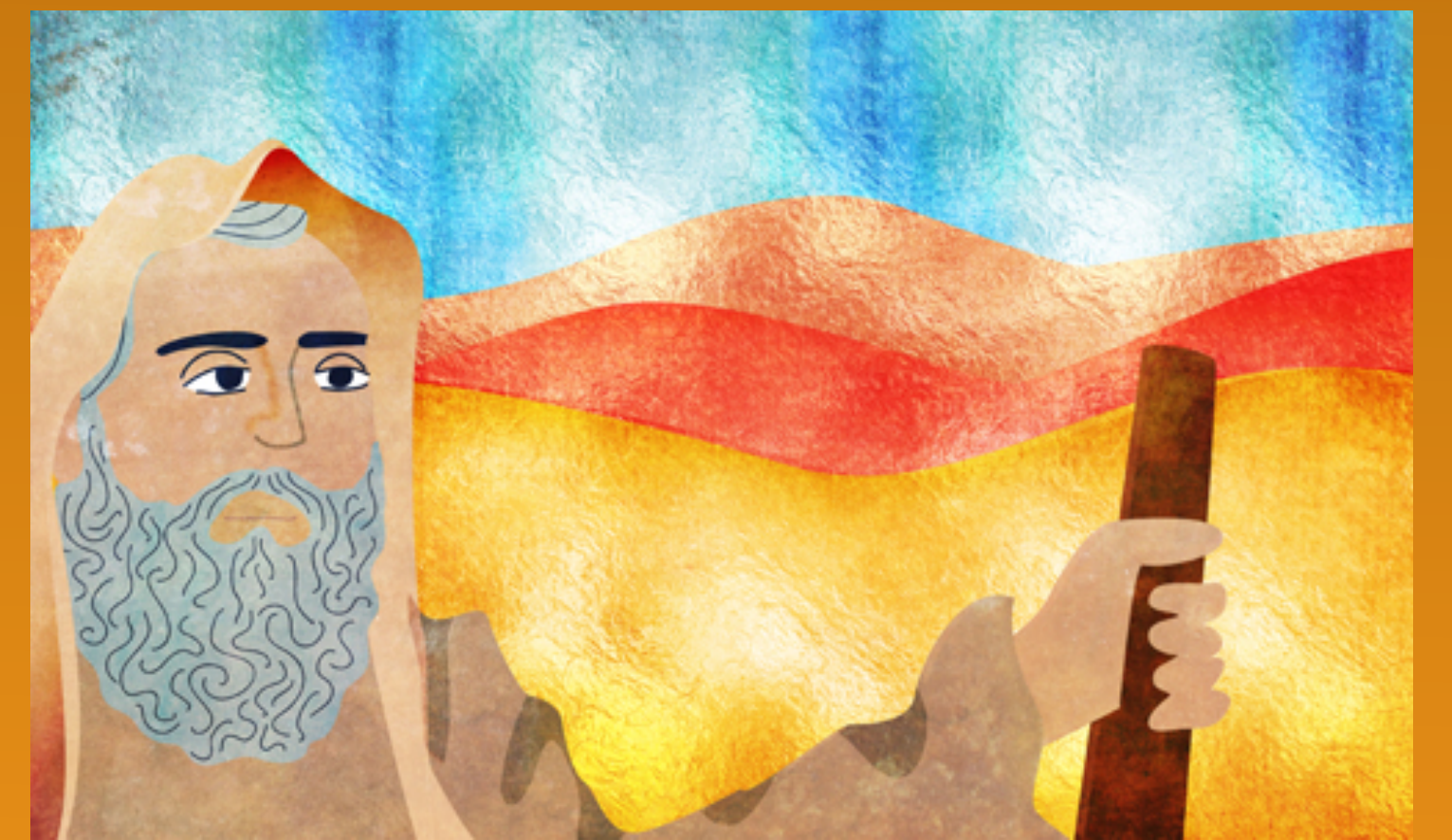

“Samuel - The Listening Prophet &
an Eavesdropping Nation,” pt 2





1Sam. 1:3 ¶ Now this man would go up from his city yearly to worship and to sacrifice to the LORD of hosts in Shiloh. And the two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, were priests to the LORD there.



1Sam. 1:12 ¶ Now it came about, as she
continued praying before the LORD, that
Eli was watching her mouth.

1Sam. 1:13 ...So Eli thought she was drunk.

1Sam. 1:17 Then Eli answered and said, “^aGo
in peace; and may the God of Israel ^bgrant
your petition that you have asked of Him.”



1Sam. 1:24 Now when she had weaned him, she took him up with her, with a three-year-old bull and one ephah of flour and a jug of wine, and brought him to the house of the LORD in Shiloh, although the child was young.

1Sam. 1:25 Then they slaughtered the bull, and brought the boy to Eli.



1Sam. 1:26 She said, “Oh, my lord! ^aAs your soul lives, my lord, I am the woman who stood here beside you, praying to the LORD.

1Sam. 1:27 ^a“For this boy I prayed, and the LORD has given me my petition which I asked of Him.

1Sam. 1:28 ^a“So I have also ¹dedicated him to the LORD; as long as he lives he is ¹dedicated to the LORD.” And ^bhe worshiped the LORD there.



1Sam. 2:11 ¶ Then Elkanah went home to Ramah, while the boy remained to minister to the LORD, in the presence of the priest Eli.



1Sam. 3:9 Therefore Eli said to Samuel, “Go, lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, ‘Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening.’” So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

1Sam. 3:10 ¶ Now the LORD came and stood there, calling as before, “Samuel! Samuel!” And Samuel said, “Speak, for your servant is listening.”



1Sam. 3:11 Then the LORD said to Samuel,
“See, I am about to do something in Israel that
will make both ears of anyone who hears of it
tingle.



1Sam. 4:4 So the people sent to Shiloh, and brought from there the ark of the covenant of the LORD of hosts, who is enthroned on the cherubim. The two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, were there with the ark of the covenant of God.



1Sam. 4:11 The ark of God was captured; and the two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, died.

1Sam. 4:17 The messenger replied, "Israel has fled before the Philistines, and there has also been a great slaughter among the troops; your two sons also, Hophni and Phinehas, are dead, and the ark of God has been captured."

1Sam. 4:18 When he mentioned the ark of God, Eli fell over backward from his seat by the side of the gate; and his neck was broken and he died, for he was an old man, and heavy. He had judged Israel forty years.



1Sam. 4:11 The ark of God was captured; and the two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, died.

1Sam. 4:17 The messenger replied, "Israel has fled before the Philistines, and there has also been a great slaughter among the troops; your two sons also, Hophni and Phinehas, are dead, and the ark of God has been captured."

1Sam. 4:18 When he mentioned the ark of God, Eli fell over backward from his seat by the side of the gate; and his neck was broken and he died, for he was an old man, and heavy. He had judged Israel forty years.



1Sam. 4:22 She said, "The glory has departed from Israel, for the ark of God has been captured."



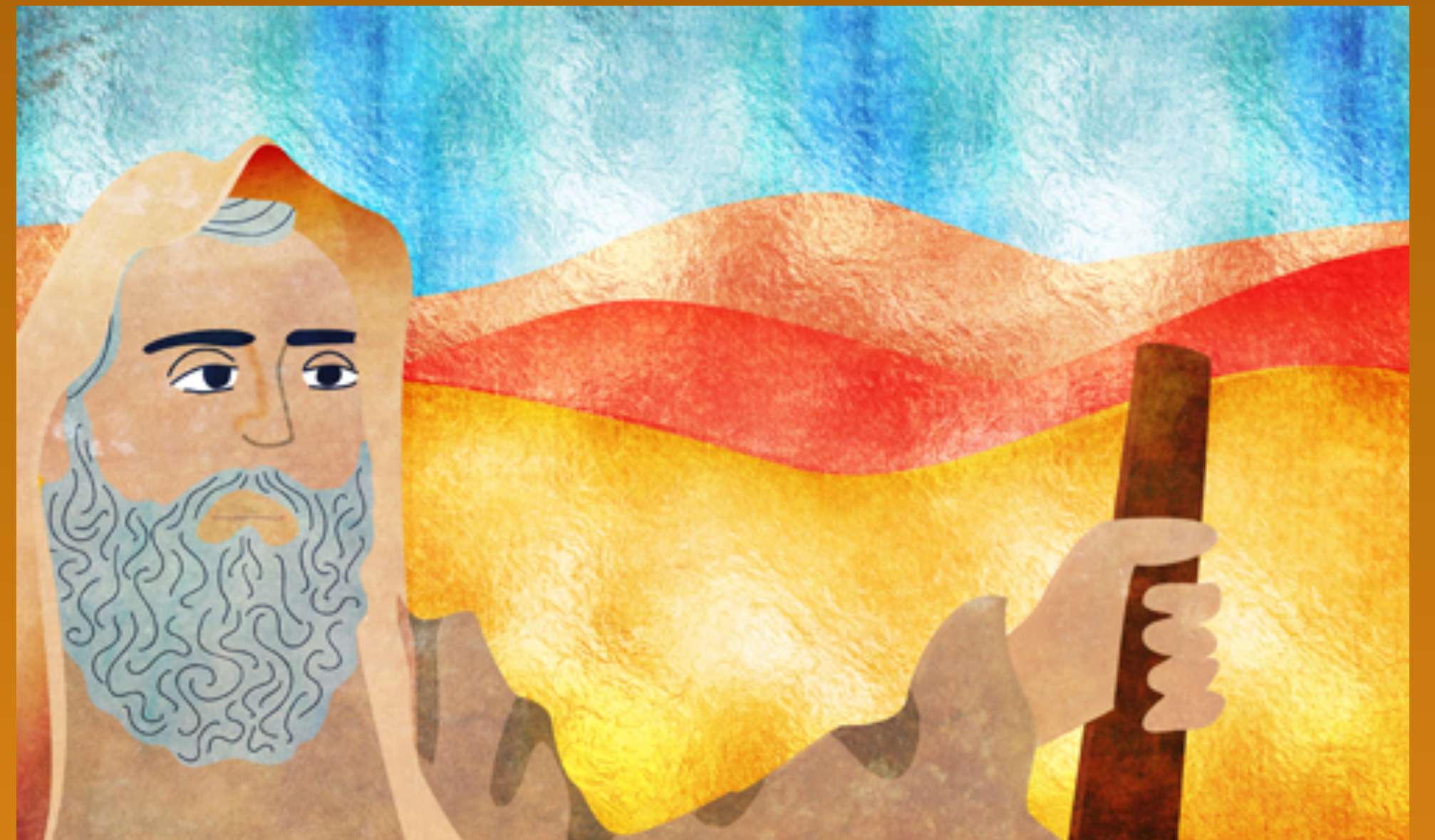
1Sam. 2:27 ¶ A man of God came to Eli and said to him, “Thus the LORD has said, ‘I revealed myself to the family of your ancestor in Egypt when they were slaves to the house of Pharaoh.

1Sam. 2:28 I chose him out of all the tribes of Israel to be my priest, to go up to my altar, to offer incense, to wear an ephod before me; and I gave to the family of your ancestor all my offerings by fire from the people of Israel.

1Sam. 2:29 Why then look with greedy eye at my sacrifices and my offerings that I commanded, and honor your sons more than me by fattening yourselves on the choicest parts of every offering of my people Israel?’

Ex. 33:11 Thus ^athe LORD used to speak to Moses face to face, just as a man speaks to his friend. When ¹Moses returned to the camp, ^bhis servant Joshua, the son of Nun, a young man, would not depart from the tent.

1Sam. 3:11 Then the LORD said to Samuel, “See, I am about to do something in Israel that will make both ears of anyone who hears of it tingle.”



1Sam. 3:21 The LORD continued to appear at Shiloh, for the LORD revealed himself to Samuel at Shiloh by the word of the LORD.

1Sam. 4:1 And the word of Samuel came to all Israel.
