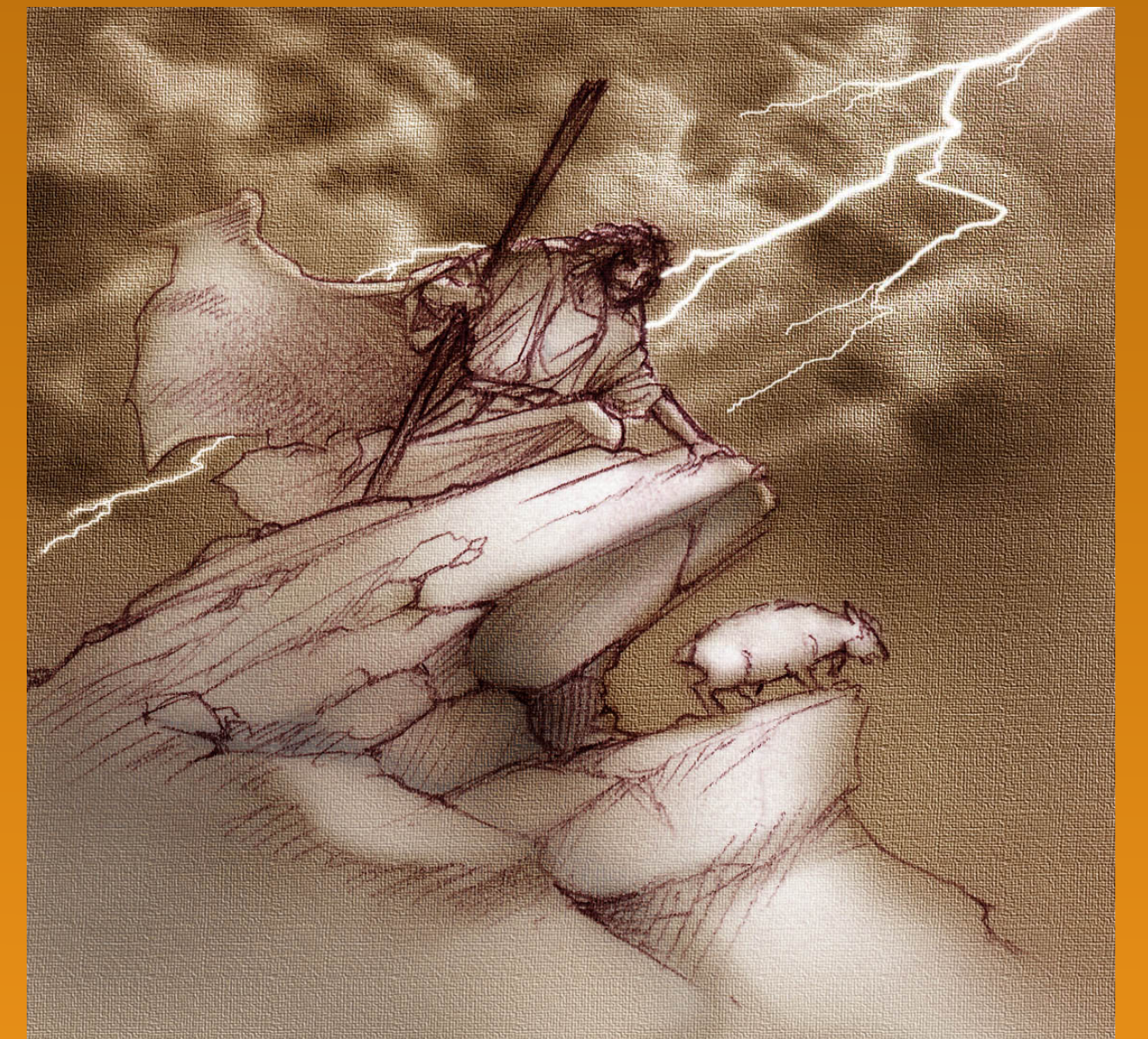

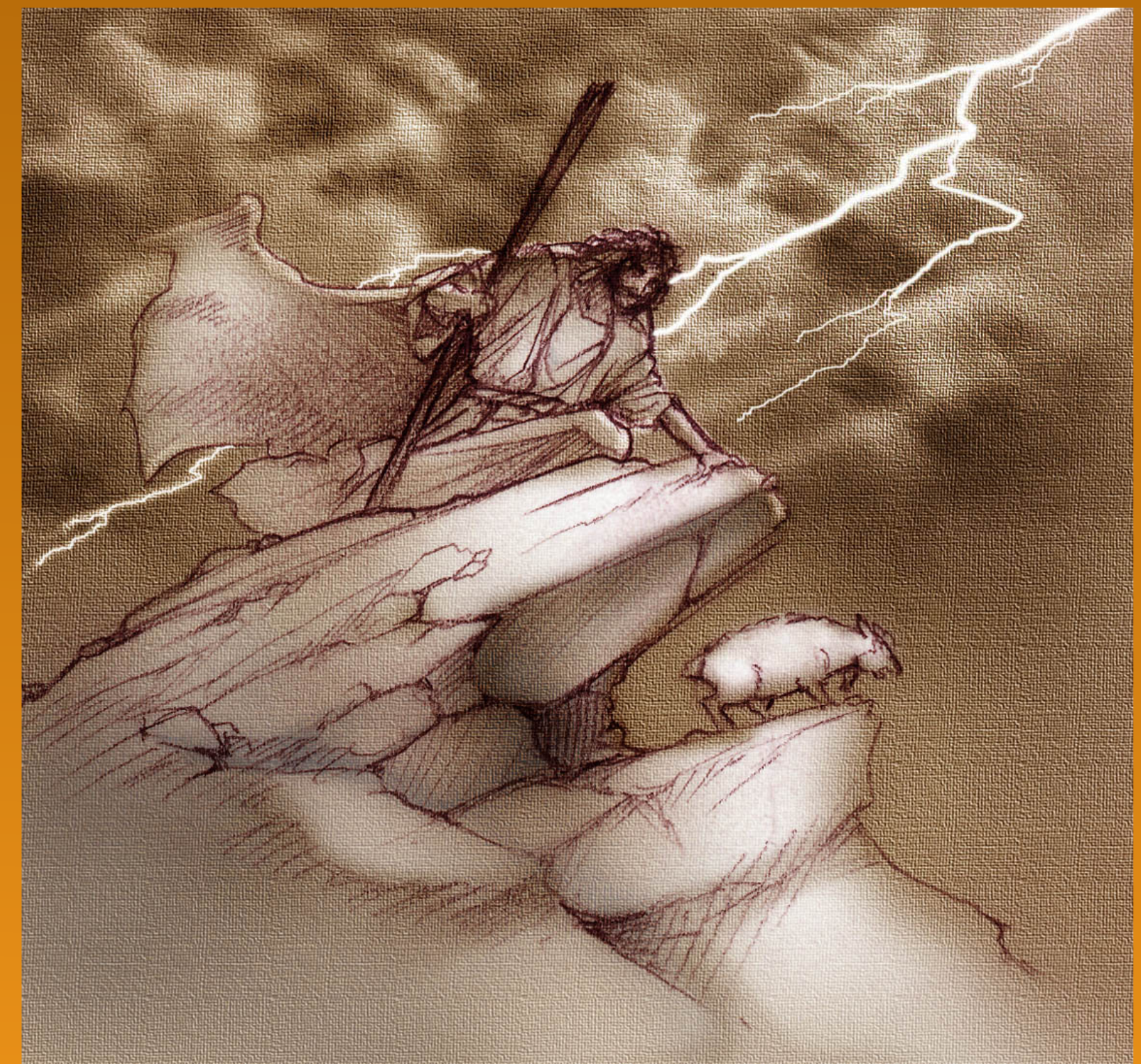
“Samuel - The Listening Prophet &
an Eavesdropping Nation,” pt 12





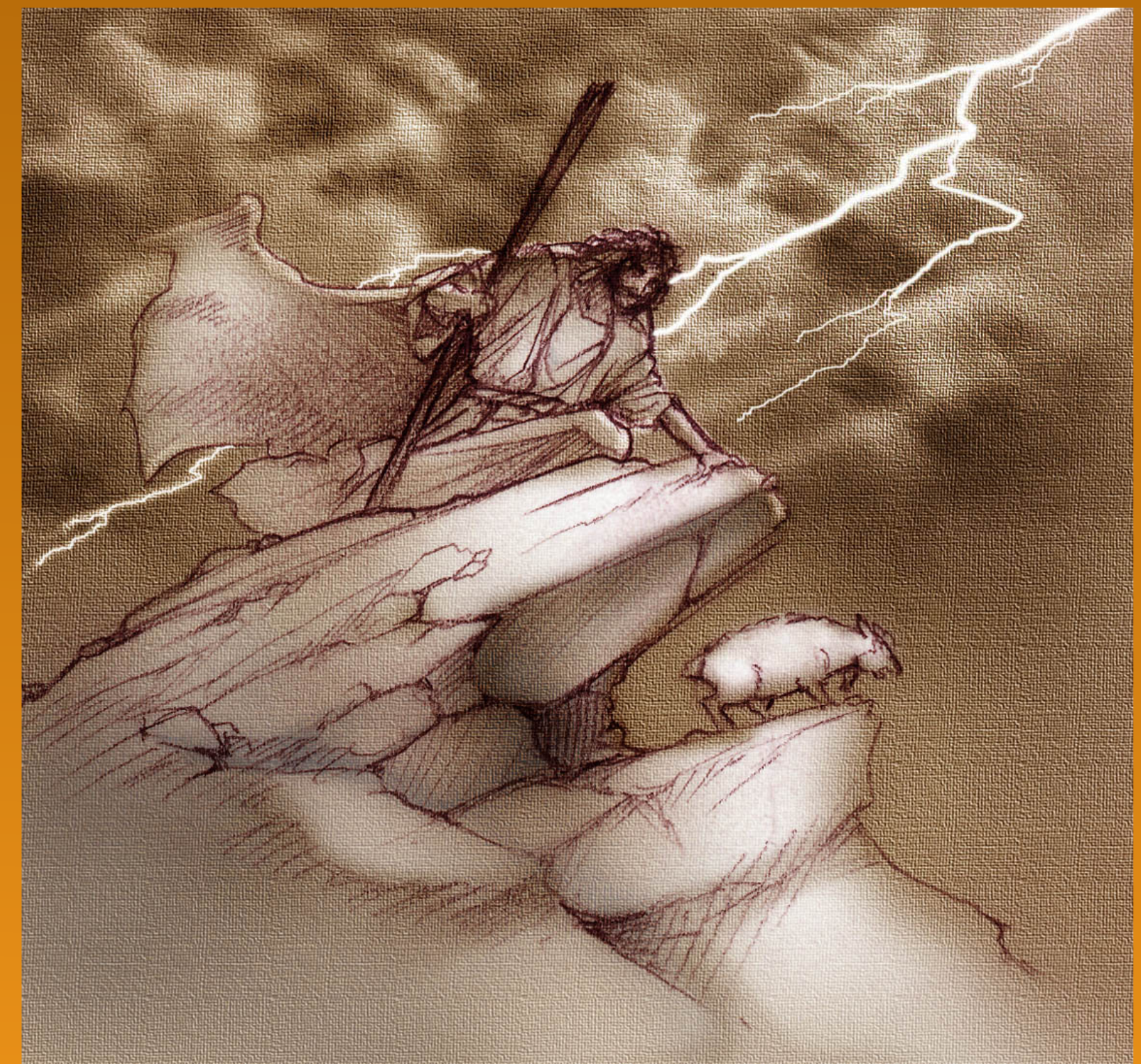
Ex. 3:1 ¶ Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian; he led his flock beyond the wilderness, and came to Horeb, the mountain of God.

2Sam. 7:8 ... Thus says the LORD of hosts: I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep to be prince over my people Israel;



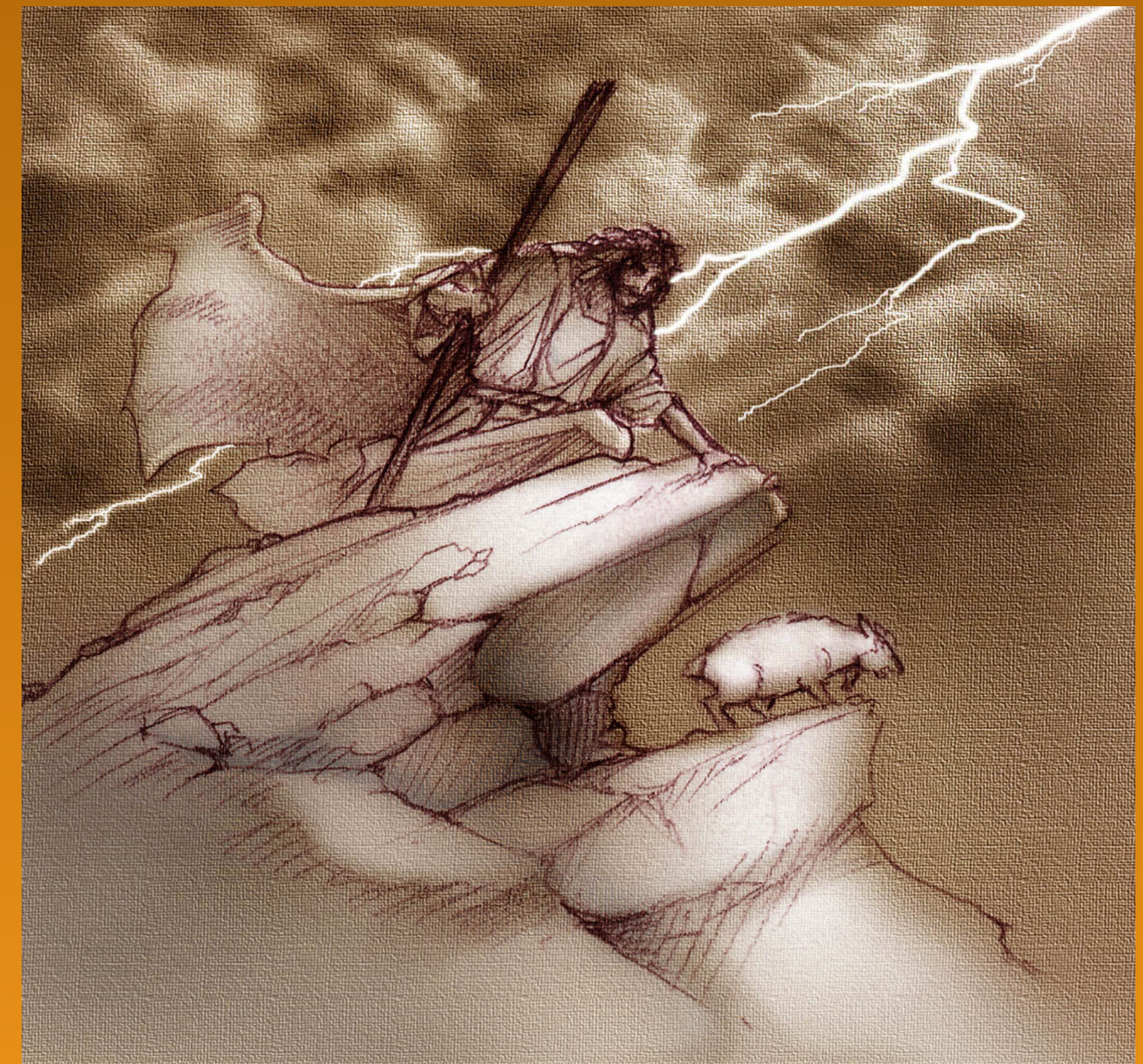
1Sam. 17:28 ¶ His eldest brother Eliab

heard him talking to the men; and Eliab's anger was kindled against David. He said, "Why have you come down? With whom have you left those few sheep in the wilderness? I know your presumption and the evil of your heart; for you have come down just to see the battle."



1Sam. 17:34 But David said to Saul, "Your servant used to keep sheep for his father; and whenever a lion or a bear came, and took a lamb from the flock,

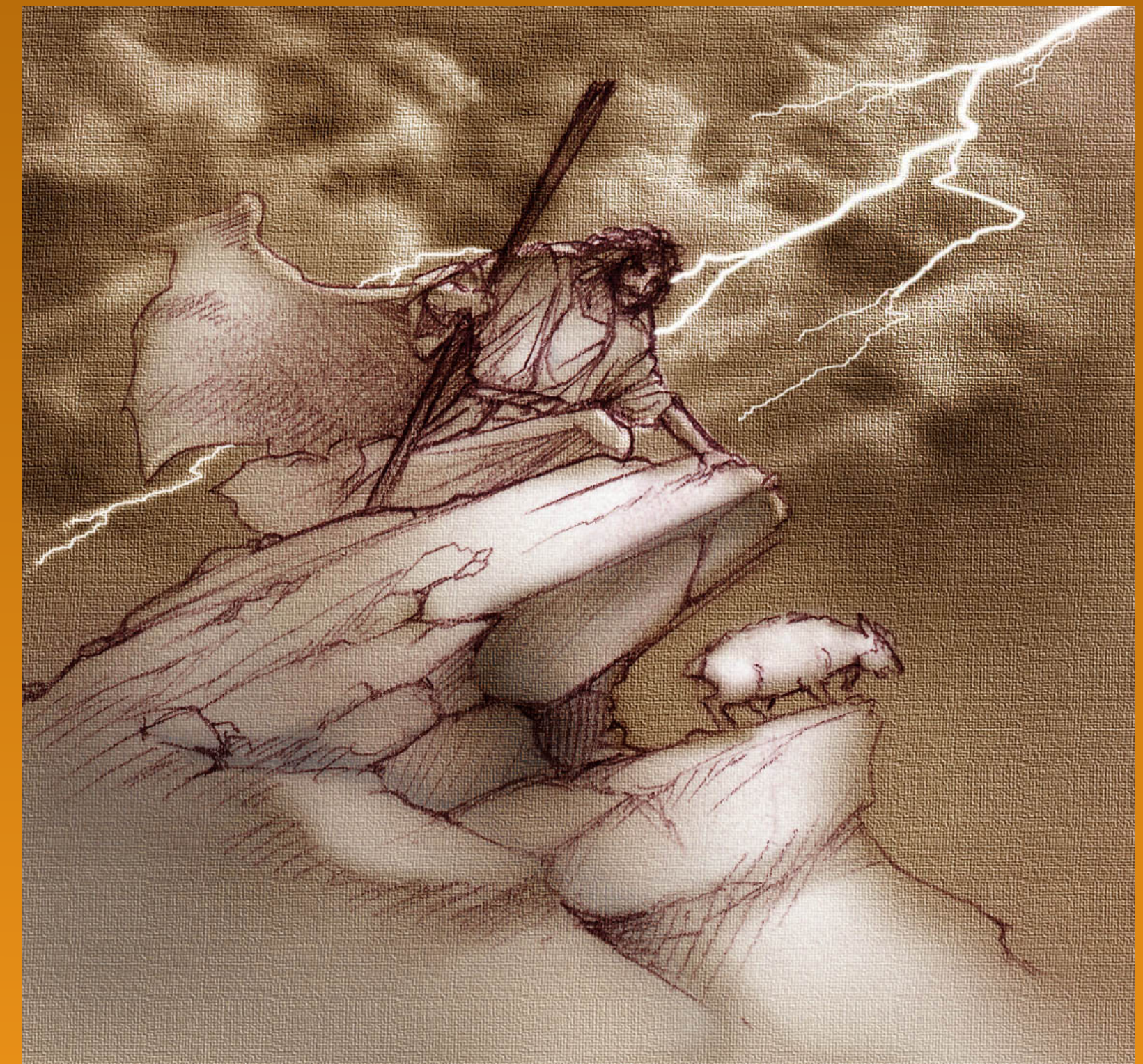
1Sam. 17:35 I went after it and struck it down, rescuing the lamb from its mouth; and if it turned against me, I would catch it by the jaw, strike it down, and kill it.



Matt. 18:12 What do you think? If a shepherd has a hundred sheep, and one of them has gone astray, does he not leave the ninety-nine on the mountains and go in search of the one that went astray?

Matt. 18:13 And if he finds it, truly I tell you, he rejoices over it more than over the ninety-nine that never went astray.

Matt. 18:14 So it is not the will of your Father in heaven that one of these little ones should be lost.



Luke 15:4 “Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it?

Luke 15:5 When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices.

Luke 15:6 And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbors, saying to them, ‘Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.’

Luke 15:7 Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance.



2Sam. 7:12 When your days are fulfilled and you lie down with your ancestors, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come forth from your body, and I will establish his kingdom.

2Sam. 7:13 He shall build a house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever.



2Sam. 7:9 and I have been with you wherever you went, and have cut off all your enemies from before you; and I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth.

2Sam. 7:10 And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may live in their own place, and be disturbed no more; and evildoers shall afflict them no more, as formerly,

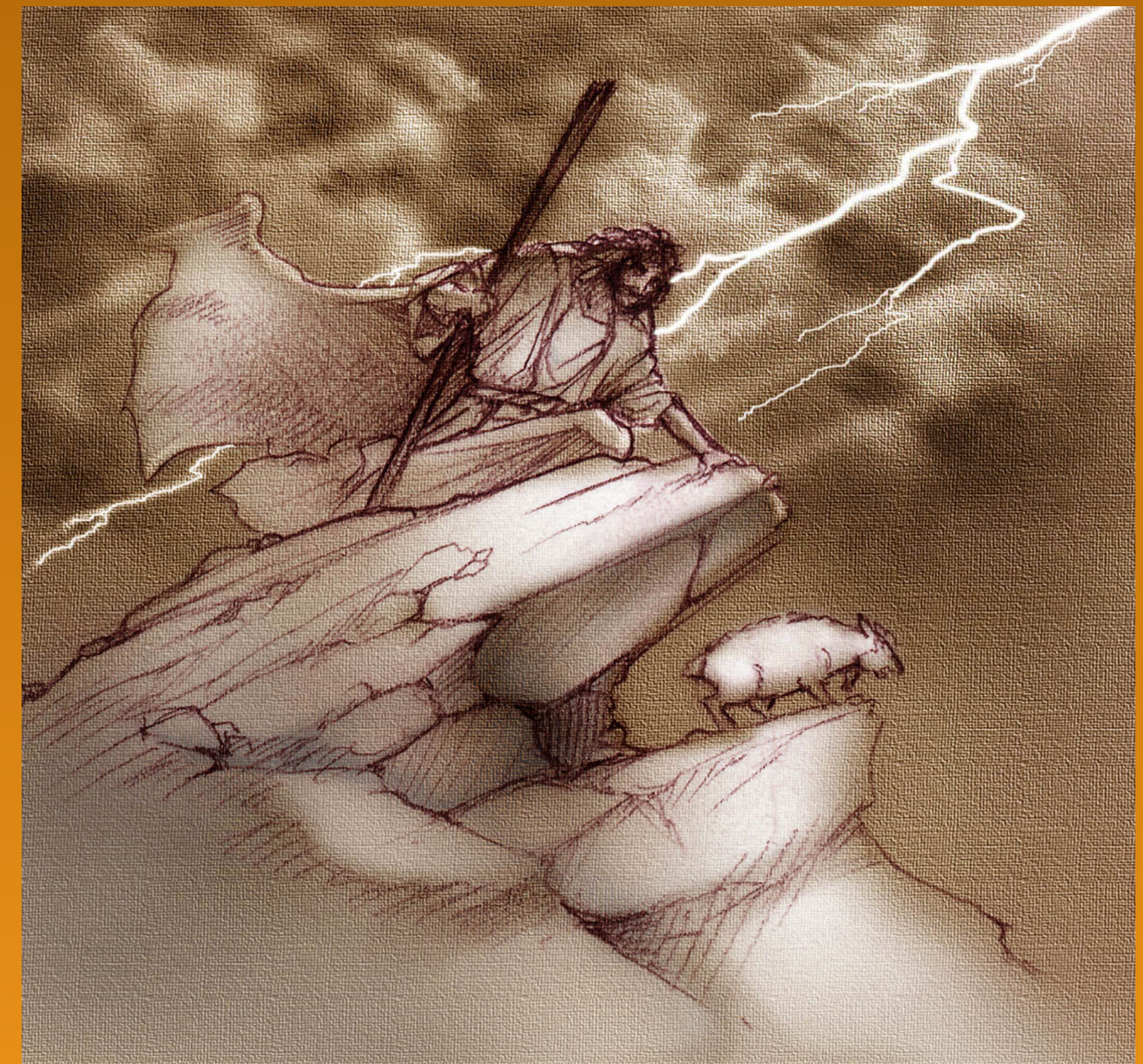
