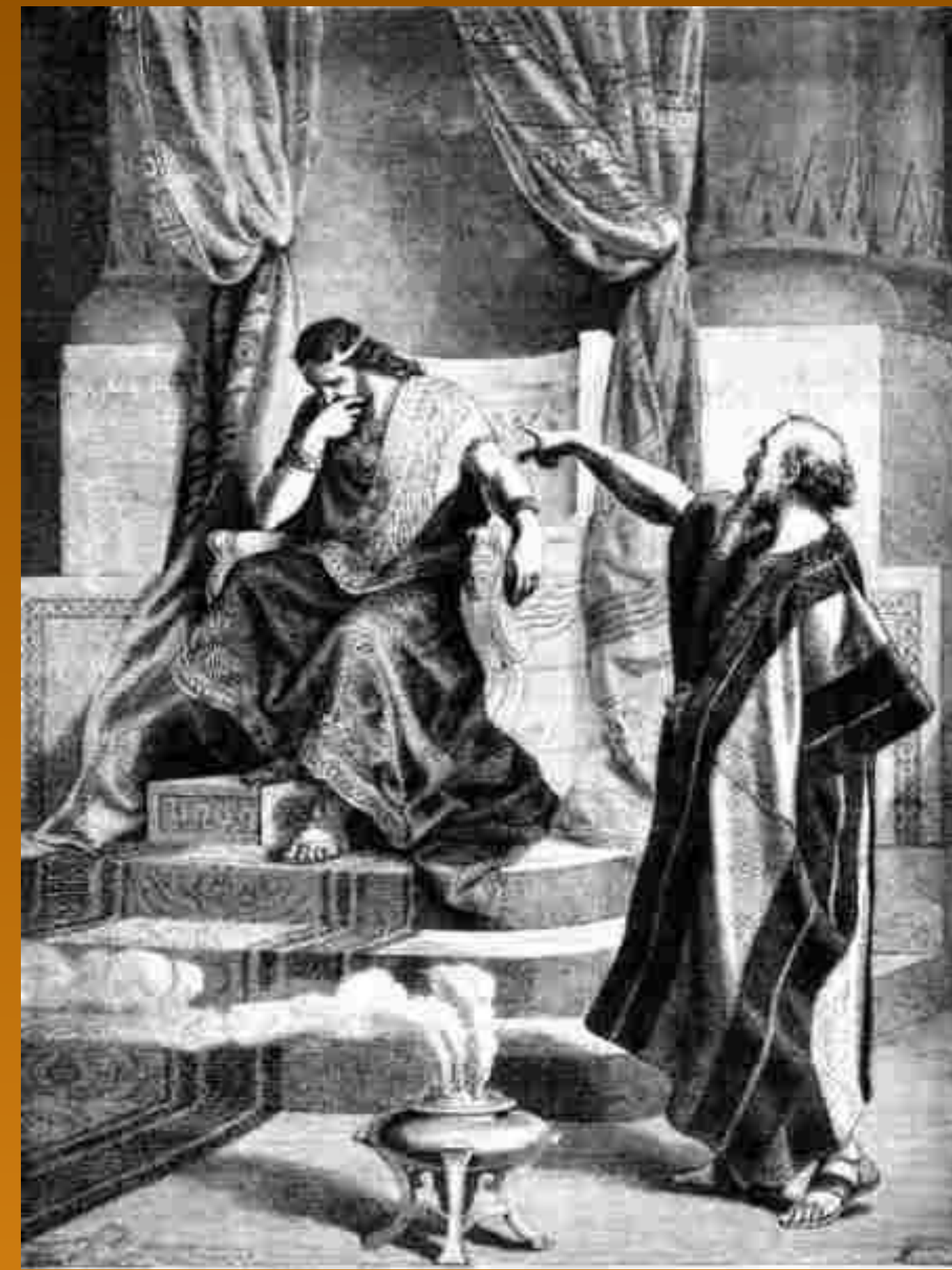


"The Aftermath - A Crushed Rejoicing"

2Sam. 11:8 Then David said to Uriah,
“Go down to your house, and wash
your feet.” Uriah went out of the
king’s house, and there followed him a
present from the king.



2Sam. 11:9 But Uriah slept at the entrance of the king's house with all the servants of his lord, and did not go down to his house.

2Sam. 11:10 When they told David, "Uriah did not go down to his house," David said to Uriah, "You have just come from a journey. Why did you not go down to your house?"



2Sam. 11:11 Uriah said to David, "The ark and Israel and Judah remain in booths; and my lord Joab and the servants of my lord are camping in the open field; shall I then go to my house, to eat and to drink, and to lie with my wife? As you live, and as your soul lives, I will not do such a thing."



2Sam. 11:14 ¶ In the morning David wrote a letter to Joab, and sent it by the hand of Uriah.

2Sam. 11:15 In the letter he wrote, “Set Uriah in the forefront of the hardest fighting, and then draw back from him, so that he may be struck down and die.”



2Sam. 11:24 Then the archers shot at your servants from the wall; some of the king's servants are dead; and your servant Uriah the Hittite is dead also.”



2Sam. 11:25 David said to the messenger, "Thus you shall say to Joab, 'Do not let this matter trouble you, for the sword devours now one and now another; press your attack on the city, and overthrow it.' And encourage him."



2Sam. 11:26 ¶ Now when the wife of Uriah heard that Uriah her husband was dead, she mourned for her husband.

2Sam. 11:27 When the time of mourning was over, David sent and brought her to his house and she became his wife; then she bore him a son...



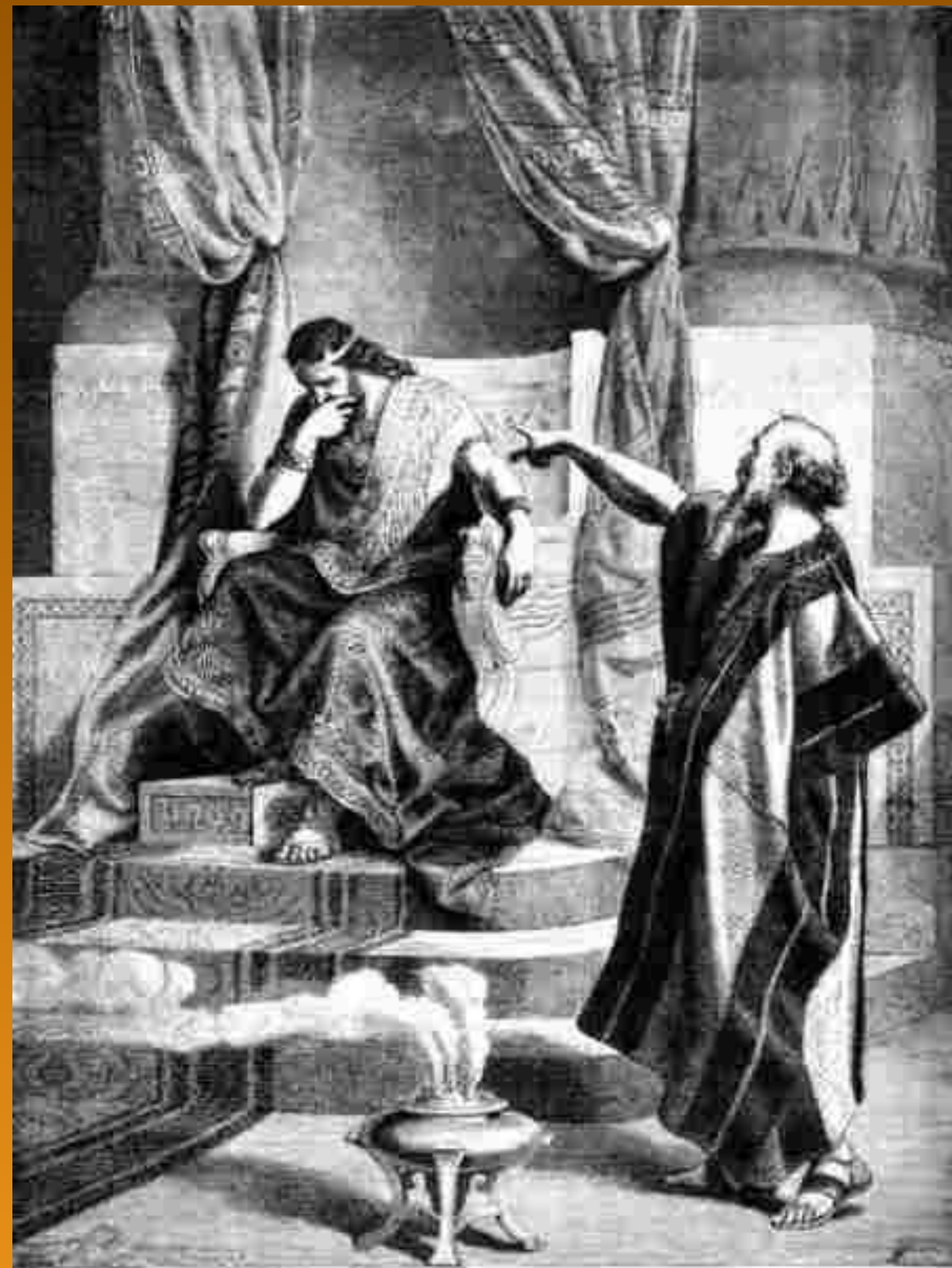
2Sam. 11:27 ... But the thing that David had done was evil in the sight of the LORD.



2Sam. 12:1 and the LORD sent Nathan to David. He came to him, and said to him, "There were two men in a certain city, the one rich and the other poor..."



2Sam. 12:3 but the poor man had nothing but one little ewe lamb, which he had bought. He brought it up, and it grew up with him and with his children; it used to eat of his meager fare, and drink from his cup, and lie in his bosom, and it was like a daughter to him.



2Sam. 12:6 "He must make
restitution for the lamb fourfold,

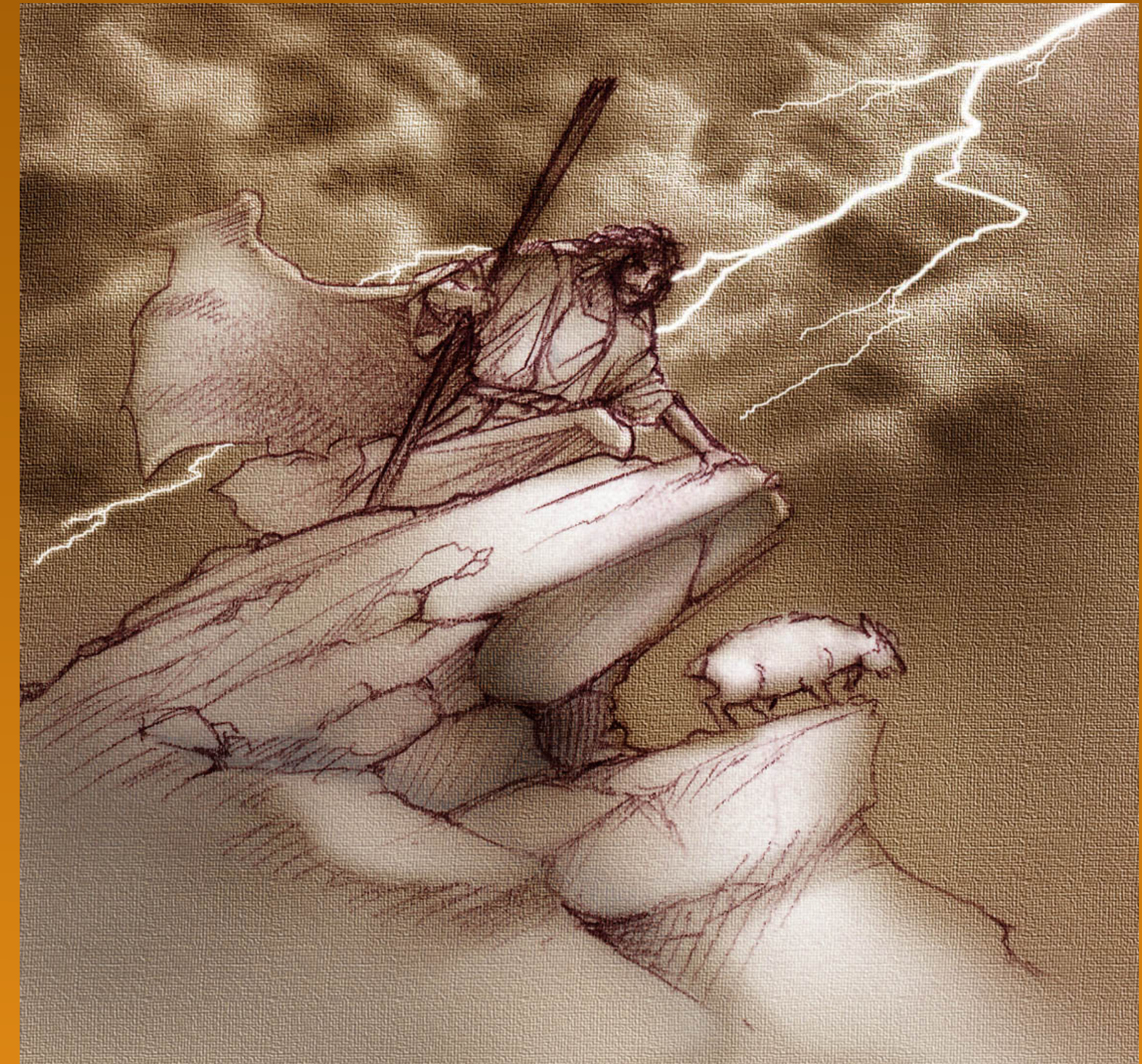
2Sam. 12:13 David said to Nathan, “I have sinned against the LORD.”

transgressions.



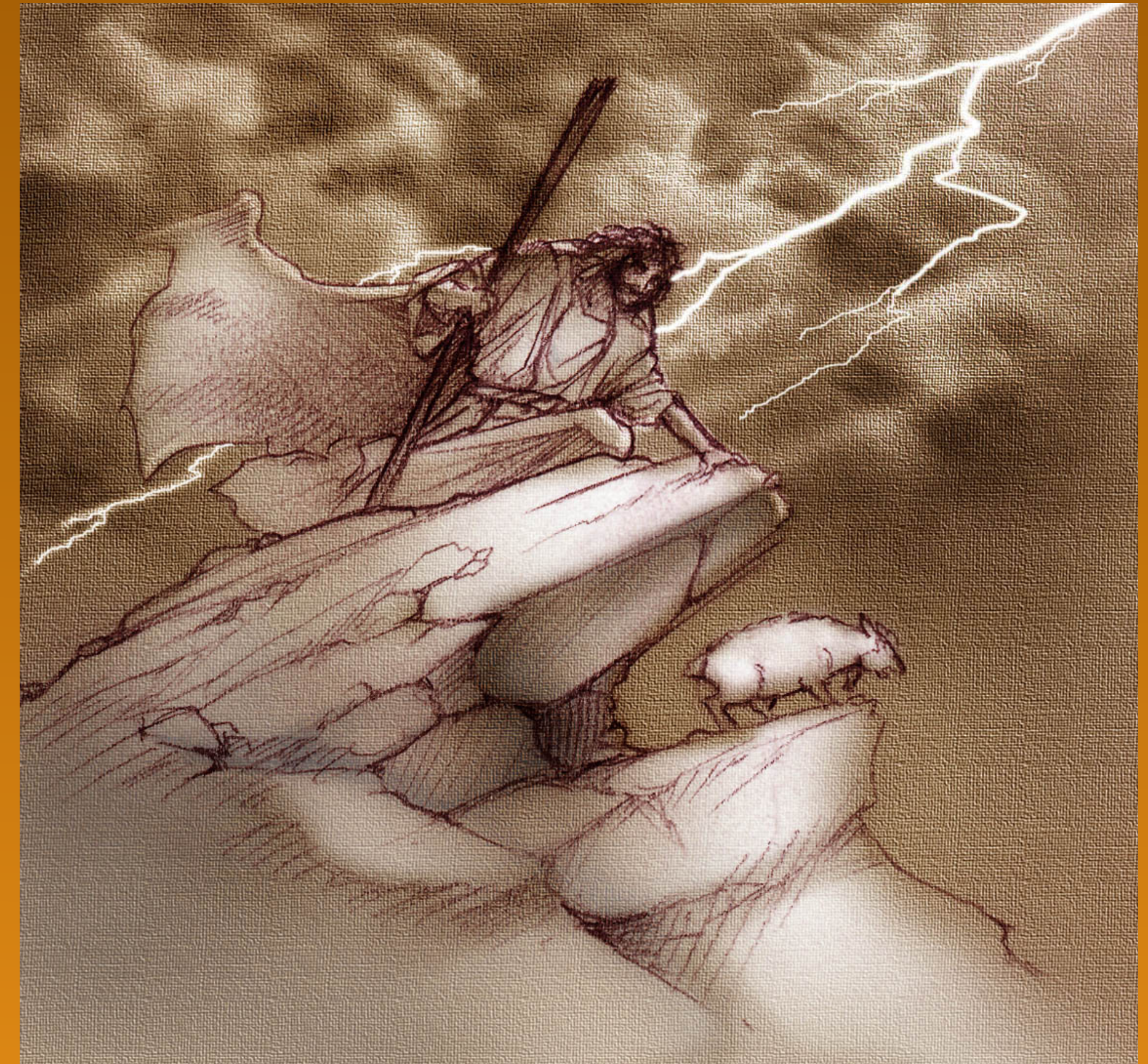
Psa. 51:8 Let me hear joy and
